25	filed. And my understanding is that Defense is 3

requesting, uh, that the matters be heard in person rather 1 than, uh, by Zoom video. And because the Defendant's in 2 3 custody, I just wanted to make sure there was a record 4 that this delay is in fact attributable to the Defense 5 since they are unwilling to go forward with the motions on 6 7 MR. ROCKIND: They're attributable to us. 8 MS. HAND: -- on Zoom. 9 MR. ROCKIND: We accept the -- we accept the --10 the delay. It's on us. 11 THE COURT: Okay. The other thing I'll say is that I am now quoting Judge Denise Page Hood from the 12 13 federal court who in her order of March 13th closing the 14 courthouse indicated that the pandemic, uh, pardon the 15 expression, trumps the -- the Defendant's rights to speedy 16 trial. Uh, I -- I'm adopting that given the situation that we're in right now. We are not allowed to hold 17 hearings. This is not an essential criminal matter, uh, 18 19 at this point. So, we can't do a live hearing. We hope 20 that we'll be back in the courtrooms in -- sometime in 21 mid-July but I can't promise that. They've got to do some 22 work in our courtrooms physically. And, uh, so, I think I gave you guys a September date. Is that what it was? 23 24 MS. HAND: Uh, we don't really have a date. But 25 they would just need to re-practipe their motions at a

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time when the court is open is my understanding. If there 1 is a date that's been picked, I'm unaware. 2 THE COURT: Uh, well, this is gonna be -- this 3 4 is hearing, right? So, I'm not --5 MR. ROCKIND: Yes. THE COURT: -- do it on a Weds -- Wednesday. 6 (to the clerk) You know, let's just --7 8 MS. HAND: (indiscernible) --9 THE COURT: -- just -- just to keep the case moving, Colleen (ph), can you give us a date sometime in 10 11 late July, early August for a -- for an evidentiary 12 hearing? 13 MS. HAND: Your Honor, this is not an 14 evidentiary hearing. These are just arguments on motions. 15 No hearing's been granted at this point. It was just like 16 six motions. So, there's not any testimony that's gonna 17 be taken yet. THE COURT: All right. Well, I don't want --18 19 MS. HAND: (indiscernible) --20 THE COURT: -- do it on -- okay. I don't want 21 to do it --22 MR. ROCKIND: Uh --23 THE COURT: -- on a Wednesday 'cause that's 24 gonna -- then we're gonna be so backed up; it's nuts. 25 MS. HAND: Right. 5

1	MR. ROCKIND: And we may have some visuals for
2	the Court to aid in some of the issues that are
3	THE COURT: Are there
4	MR. ROCKIND: (indiscernible).
5	THE COURT: videos that I need to, uh, view?
6	MS. HAND: Yes. Judge, I have attached I
7	attached and I think Mr. Rockind did, too, to our motions
8	which were filed before COVID occurred. So, they were
9	physically filed with the Court.
10	I Neil, when do you think? Like, back in
11	March? Or I don't even
12	MR. ROCKIND: Yeah. I think so.
13	MS. HAND: remember. I think
14	THE COURT: If you get
15	MS. HAND: There was a lot of (indiscernible)
16	THE COURT: If if you get those videos to
17	(to the clerk) Colleen, can you get them to
